The public and media are invited to observe the Remembrance ceremonies for ***‘No Stone Left Alone’*** in Penticton. In their inaugural year with NSLA, students from KVR Middle School, accompanied by soldiers from the British Columbia Dragoons, will place poppies at veterans’ gravesites at the Lakeview Cemetery, 775 Lower Bench Road, Penticton

***‘No Stone Left Alone’*** is an initiative involving school students who honour and recognize the sacrifices that Canadian military men and women made while serving Canada. In November, ***‘No Stone Left Alone’*** ceremonies throughout Canada will have students place a poppy on veterans’ headstones in community cemeteries. This year, Canada’s 150<sup>th</sup>, will for the first time in ***‘No Stone Left Alone’s’*** short seven-year life will be coast-to-coast-to-coast. Over 7,000 students from over 60 schools across all 10 provinces and the three Territories will lay over 40,000 poppies on the graves of veterans in over 100 cemeteries. This year also marks the first time NSLA ceremonies have been conducted overseas with a ceremony in Poland on the 1<sup>st</sup> of September.
