



## How does it work?

The City of Penticton is issuing "Resident Parking" permits to residents of streets included in designated Resident Parking Only Areas.

You will need three things to apply for your permits:



**Completed vehicle registration form**

**Proof of address (copy of driver's licence, piece of mail like a utility or cable bill, tenancy agreement)**

Once these pieces are ready, drop them off at or send them back to City Hall. We will mail you the passes you requested. If you cannot come into the office, please email [parking@penticton.ca](mailto:parking@penticton.ca) with "Resident Parking Pass" in the subject line. We are happy to accommodate you.

## Enforcement

City staff will be enforcing the parking rules by patrolling areas on a limited basis. When vehicles are parked in Resident Parking Only Areas without a permit on display, violation notices and parking tickets could be issued. The parking permit program is designed to encourage appropriate parking practices; therefore, education will be a key component of the program.

# Resident Parking Program

The City of Penticton is implementing a new "Resident Parking" program in designated areas to improve the amount of parking available for you and your guests.

## Why the program was created

Some areas of our City see a lot of out-of-town traffic during peak tourist times, and not all visitors have respected residents' needs to access their driveways and lanes. Other residents who live by large employers also struggle with congested streets, as employees park their vehicles for the day in residential areas and walk to work.



Shifting to a "Resident Parking" program in specific areas is designed to alleviate this — encouraging visitor and commuter traffic to choose more

appropriate places to leave vehicles, like parking lots.

## Permits are available

Residents in each house or townhouse will be given two parking permits. Homes with registered secondary suites will be issued one parking permit on behalf of their tenants. Guest parking passes are also available.

If you live in an apartment or condominium with its own resident lot, you do not fall under the program; however, you are welcome to sign up for guest parking passes to allow your visitors to park on the street. While street parking is never guaranteed, reserving specific streets for you and your guests will help free up space for those who live there.

## Free service to residents

Resident, secondary suite and guest parking permits are all free. Transferring permits also does not come with a cost for residents — although there is a nominal charge for replacement permits.
