

Temporary Overnight Sheltering in Parks

Only people who have no access to any form of indoor shelter are permitted to shelter overnight in parks during the overnight hours of 7 p.m. and 9 a.m.

For a list of parks where overnight sheltering is not allowed, please review the maps provided on the reverse and the requirements below.

No sheltering in:



Environmentally or culturally sensitive areas



Playgrounds



Community gardens/ horticultural areas



Cemeteries



Sports fields

Shelters must be:

9 m² (approx. 96 ft sq.)

Footpaths/roads



No bigger than 9 square metres 4m/13ft


4 metres from private properties and environmentally or culturally sensitive areas


4 meters of a sports field or court, footpath or road within a park

15m / 49ft




15 metres of a playground, spray or wading pool

Attach shelters to trees. plants, benches, lamp posts or other structures



Remove tree branches or use City property to construct shelters



Have open fires
