Dear Resident or Property Owner:

Re: Manitoba Street – Multi-use Pathway, Waterworks & Traffic Safety Improvements

The City of Penticton's Engineering Department is advising residents of the upcoming construction along Manitoba St between Duncan Ave E and Forestbrook Dr, scheduled to begin in early March 2026. This project will improve pedestrian safety in response to neighbourhood feedback and the Safe Routes to School study.

Project Highlights:

- Traffic calming improvements, including 30 km/hr speed limits, traffic buttons at Edmonton Ave and Penticton Ave intersections, and speed humps
- New multi-use pathway from Duncan Ave E to Forestbrook Dr, new pedestrian crossings and a raised crosswalk
- Improved roadway and pedestrian lighting
- Water main and service replacements (Duncan Ave E to Penticton Ave) and drainage improvements

Construction Schedule:

- **Start:** Beginning of March 2026
- **Completion:** End of June 2026
- **Working Hours:**
 - Mon–Fri: 7:00AM–5:00PM
 - Extended hours may occur within permitted times (up to 10:00PM weekdays; 9:00AM to 5:00PM weekends).

Schedules may change due to weather, material delays, or unforeseen underground conditions.

Access & Closures:

- Expect temporary road closures and limited access at times
- Residents will receive 48 hours' notice for planned service interruptions or access restrictions
- Emergency access will be maintained
- Updates: penticton.ca/roadwork, public notices, and social media

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

- **What will happen to the road?**
The west side of Manitoba St will receive new curb and multi-use pathway and there will be general patch paving. Driveway access will be restored to match the new road grade.
- **Can I park on the street?**
During construction, on-street parking will not be permitted. Once construction is complete, parking will be permitted on both sides of the road. Resident only parking and associated signage will be re-instated.
- **Will I have access to my home?**
Yes, access will be maintained as much as possible. Temporary closures may occur during paving or utility tie-ins. Advanced notice will be provided.
- **Will my driveway be impacted?**
If your driveway is affected, we will reach out to you directly in advance. If there is any disruption, efforts will be made to restore the driveway to match the original where applicable.
- **Will there be road closures? How will I get around?**
The contractor will try and limit impacts of intermittent delays and road closures. See <https://www.penticton.ca/city-services/roadwork-construction/road-closures> for up to date information.
- **Will my water or electrical services be affected?**
Yes, temporary services disruptions may occur with these new utility installations. You will receive notice 48 hours' in advance of any planned outages, and crews will work diligently to minimize disruptions to return services to normal use.
- **Will my landscaping be impacted?**
Landscaping within the boulevard or utility corridors may be affected. Any disruption will include restoration to match original, which may include topsoil, planting, or sod, where applicable. Affected homeowners will be contacted in advance.
- **Will mail and garbage services be affected?**
These services will continue with minimal disruption. Please follow any temporary signage or crew instructions.
