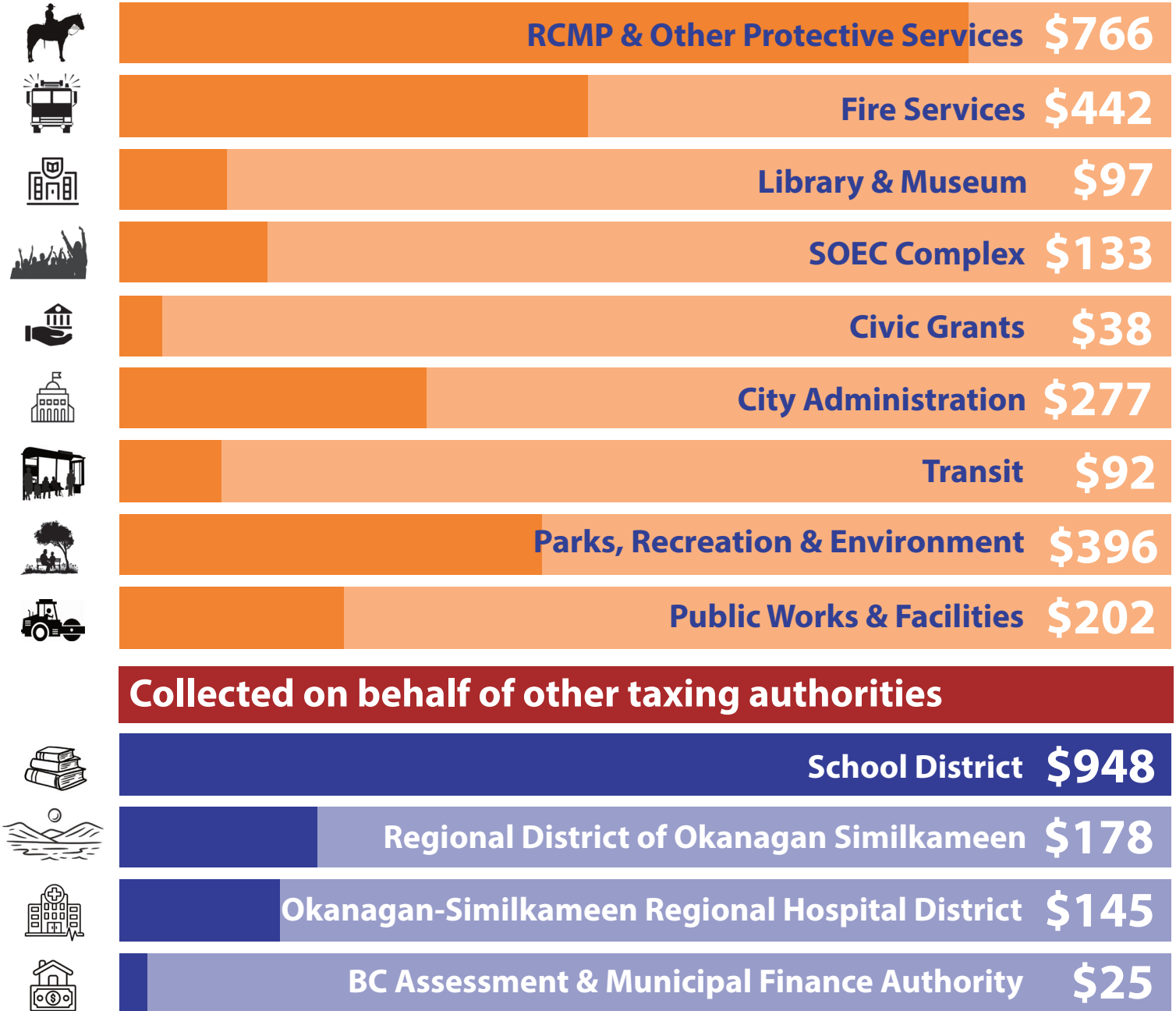


What will my 2026 taxes pay for?

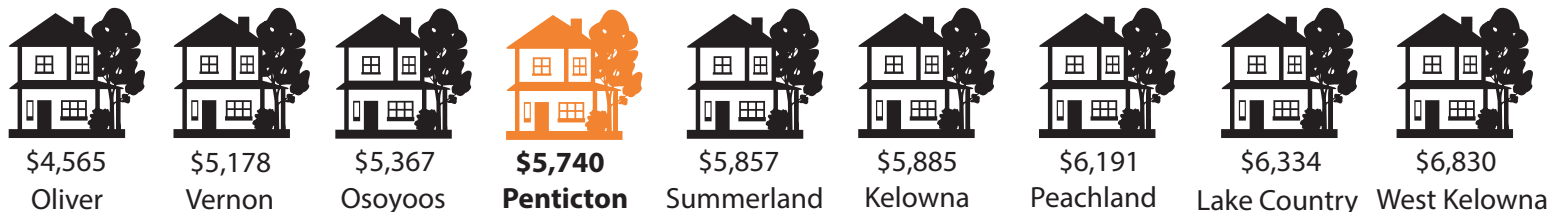
Your Total Property Taxes

The City of Penticton, like all B.C. municipalities, collects property taxes on behalf of other provincial and regional authorities. A homeowner in Penticton whose home is assessed at \$645,044 will pay approximately:

Paying your property taxes

Property taxes and Home Owner Grants must be received by 4:00 p.m. on **Thursday, July 2, 2026**

Avoid a 10% penalty by paying your taxes and claiming your Home Owner Grant before July 2, 2026

Online or Phone Banking

When paying with online or telephone banking, through your financial institution, please **allow 3-5 business days** for the City to receive your payment.



Pay online with your credit card

Visit the online services page of the City website to make a payment through our third party provider (service fees will apply).

By Mail or Courier



Avoid line-ups by mailing or sending your payment by courier to:

Cheques may be postdated for July 2.

In Person



Bring your bill and payment to City Hall, Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Please note:

City Hall accepts Visa and MasterCard (surcharges will apply).

Paying by debit?

Know your limit!

Most financial institutions have a daily or per transaction limit on payments.

Plan ahead. Prepay your taxes for 2027!

Pay your 2026 Property taxes and claim the Home Owner Grant, if eligible, by July 2, 2026 then choose one of the following two options to prepay your 2027 taxes.

Pre-Authorized Withdrawals (PAWs)

The City of Penticton offers an automatic pre-authorized debit plan for property owners to prepay their taxes monthly.

How to Apply

- Complete the City of Penticton PAWs application form
- Obtain a void cheque or PAD form from your bank
- Submit completed form and void cheque in person or email to taxclk@penticton.ca by July 15, 2026
- Include 2 pieces of ID (1 photo)

Scheduled Online/Telebanking

- Log on to your financial institution to add payee
- Search for "Penticton" and select Taxes
- Use your 8-digit folio number (exclude the hyphen) as your account number
- Set a recurring convenient monthly payment

Claiming your Home Owner Grant

An unclaimed grant means unpaid taxes!

Claim your grant every year you are eligible by the due date to avoid a 10% penalty.

You must apply for your Home Owner Grant directly with the Province of BC.

Property Tax Deferment Program

The Property Tax Deferment Program is a provincial loan program designed to help qualified homeowners pay their annual property taxes.

Residential Properties Additional School Tax

Residential properties valued above \$3 million may be subject to Additional School Tax of 0.2% or 0.4%.
