



# How to Participate at the Public Hearing

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, and in accordance with Ministerial Order M192, the City will be conducting Public Hearings in multiple ways - in person, with written submissions, telephone or our new option - via Zoom.

**To watch the Public Hearing, please view the live stream on the City's website.**

For those without access to internet, a viewing opportunity will take place for the Public Hearing for Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No. 2020-48 (Lake-to-Lake Bike Route) at the Cleland Theatre at 7:30 p.m.

**Safeguarding public health is our top priority – consider written submissions, telephone or Zoom as an alternative to attending in person.**

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## How to participate in writing:

1. Submit comments by mail or place in the drop box outside City Hall to the attention of the Corporate Officer, City of Penticton, 171 Main Street, Penticton, BC V2A 5A9.
2. Email comments to the attention of the Corporate Officer at [publichearings@penticton.ca](mailto:publichearings@penticton.ca)
3. Written submissions will be accepted until 9:30 a.m. on the day of the Public Hearing.
4. No letter, report or representation from the public will be received by Council after the conclusion of the Public Hearing. Please note that your name and address and will form part of the public record.

## How to participate via telephone:

1. Visit <https://www.penticton.ca/city-hall/news-alerts/public-notices-november-16-2020-public-hearing> for the call in number and participant details.
2. **10 minutes before the beginning of the Public Hearing**, call the phone number and follow the prompts.
3. You will be muted upon entry to the Public Hearing. A staff member may ask for your name or you will be identified as Caller and the last four digits of your phone number.
4. **There will be a wait time** - you may hear others joining the public hearing.

5. **The Public Hearing will begin at the scheduled time** with an introduction. When the Mayor asks the public for the first time if anyone would like to speak to the bylaw, those on the telephone, Zoom and in person will alternate speaking opportunities.
6. A staff person will say your name or Caller and the last four digits of your phone number and ask you to unmute your phone (\*6).
7. All speakers are asked to restrict their comments to three minutes. Please provide Council with your name and the street you live on.
8. After you speak, you may hang up **or** remain on the call to speak again. The Mayor will ask the public for a second and third time if anyone would like to speak to the bylaw. You will be unmuted and asked to provide your additional comments.
9. The Public Hearing will continue until all in attendance and those participating electronically have had a chance to be heard.
10. Council will listen to the views of the public, no decisions will be made at the Public Hearing.

## **How to participate via Zoom:**

1. Visit <https://www.penticton.ca/city-hall/news-alerts/public-notices-november-16-2020-public-hearing> for the Zoom link.
2. **10 minutes before the beginning of the Public Hearing**, join the Zoom meeting and follow the prompts.
3. You will be muted upon entry to the Zoom meeting and asked to turn on your camera. A staff member may ask for your name so it can be displayed.
4. **There will be a wait time** - you may see others joining the public hearing.
5. **The Public Hearing will begin at the scheduled time** with an introduction. When the Mayor asks the public for the first time if anyone would like to speak to the bylaw, those on the telephone, Zoom and in person will alternate speaking opportunities.
6. A staff person will say your name and you will be prompted to unmute and turn on your camera if you haven't already done so.
7. All speakers are asked to restrict their comments to three minutes. Please provide Council with your name and the street you live on.
8. After you speak, you may leave **or** remain and continue to wait to speak again. The Mayor will ask the public for a second and third time if anyone would like to speak to the bylaw. You will be unmuted and asked if you have additional comments.

9. The Public Hearing will continue until all in attendance and those participating electronically have had a chance to be heard.
10. Council will listen to the views of the public, no decisions will be made at the Public Hearing.

*If you are in good health and choose to attend in person because you wish to speak, we ask that one person attend per household or organization as provincial public health order limits capacity to 50 patrons.*

### **How to participate in-person if you wish to speak:**

1. A staff person will meet you upon entry to ask health/travel questions, ask you to sanitize hands and will monitor maximum capacity numbers. If we reach capacity, we ask that you wait in your car until space is available inside or participate via zoom or telephone.
2. Please maintain physical distancing of at least 6-feet at all times. Masks are expected and will be provided. Hand sanitizer is available at multiple locations.
3. Please remain single file inside the stanchions and follow the directional signage and floor markings to Ballroom B. You are required to provide your name and phone or email to the staff person at the Ballroom door for contact tracing.
4. Please remain single file through the stanchions as you enter the Ballroom. We can accommodate **30 people at a time in the Ballroom**. Please keep your mask on while moving through the room towards the microphone.
5. **The Public Hearing will begin at the scheduled time** with an introduction. When the Mayor asks the public for the first time if anyone would like to speak to the bylaw, those on the telephone, Zoom and in person will alternate speaking opportunities.
6. Please provide Council with your name and the street you live on. All speakers are asked to restrict their comments to three minutes.
7. After you speak, please follow the stanchions and leave the Ballroom. We ask that you exit the building and view the remainder of the Public Hearing on the City's website or at the Cleland Theatre. If you have something new you'd like to say, please return to the front door and wait until there's capacity to allow you to return inside the building.
8. The Public Hearing will continue until all in attendance and those participating electronically have had a chance to be heard.
9. Council will listen to the views of the public, no decisions will be made at the Public Hearing.
