Re: Lake-to-Lake Bike Route construction on Duncan Avenue to begin

The City is writing to inform residents and businesses that construction of the Duncan section of the Lake-to-Lake Bike Route is set to begin on Tuesday, Sept. 6. Residents and businesses along Duncan Avenue between Fairview Road and Main Street can anticipate delays, road closures and detours while construction is underway, expected to continue until Oct. 31, 2022.

Here's what you need to know

- Expect one-way traffic westbound only between Main Street and Fairview Drive (the eastbound lane will be closed from Fairview).
- Abel, Baker & Atkinson Streets will be closed at Duncan Avenue.
- Traffic control people will assist pedestrians and vehicles through the work zone.
- The daily hours of construction will be 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. (no work on Sundays or statutory holidays).
- Duncan Avenue, along with all side streets, will be open at the end of each working day.
- All updates involving the project will be posted to penticton.ca/lake-to-lake.

In addition to installing a protected bike lane, this project involves adding a new signalized intersection at Atkinson and Duncan as well as concrete work, installing catch basins, street lights and traffic signals. At Atkinson, a cyclist-activated signal and pedestrian crossing will allow for safe passage across Duncan Ave.

Included with this letter is a fact sheet with map to provide an overview of the project. Regular updates will also be posted on the City's website at penticton.ca/lake-to-lake.
