4. New Business

4.1 <u>LED Scroll Light Replacement Funding – Kelsey Johnson, Manager of Recreation, Arts and Culture and Guy Pollock, Member of the Public</u>

The Manager of Recreation, Arts, and Culture introduced Guy Pollock, Member of the Public, to share ideas to move forward with the reinstallation of the LED Scroll Lights in the City of Penticton. Mr. Pollock expressed there was a desire from members of the community to see the Scroll Lights resurrected.

The Manager of Recreation, Arts, and Culture recommended that funding try to be pursued through the Arts, Creative and Cultural Innovation Advisory Committee and the Heritage and Museum Advisory Committee to split the costs of the works. She also voiced that there may be opportunity to seek public arts fund through the 'Art Reserve Fund' if this is pursed as a public art piece.

Judy Sentes, Councillor, entered the meeting at 2:40 p.m.

Calvin Meiklejohn, Member at Large, entered the meeting at 2:45 p.m.

A Member at Large raised concerns over the city fundraising for this project, as it may take away or compete with other arts organizations, and therefore suggested seeking grants by partnering with the Penticton Arts Council.

Another Member at Large suggested pursing work through the Women in Trades program at Okanagan College which could facilitate the works that would need to be done through women who are training in electrical and welding trades. Expanding on this, it was suggested that a grassroots group be considered for a community led effort to start replacement works.

It was MOVED and SECONDED

THAT the Arts, Creative and Cultural Innovations Advisory Committee recommend to Council to pursue the LED Light Scroll reinstallation project and discuss the feasibility of this project.

- Penticton Art Gallery a.
 - Public engagement is still high in the community and the recent Bob Ross exhibit proved a large success.
 - First exhibition of 2021 opens January 30 and will include virtual (Island Mountain Arts) and in public collections.
 - Mentorship program will instead have a virtual exhibition program in lieu of the in person program typically offered.
- Okanagan School of Arts (OSA) b.
 - No representative present.
- Penticton Arts Council c.
 - Arts Matter Online program is offering programs and shows by local artists.
 - 400 art packs were distributed to local social service providers and the Penticton Arts Council has been working with social service providers to deliver programs to those at risk.
 - No new in person programs or classes in accordance with COVID-19 regulations.
