1. **Call to Order**

3. **Adoption of Minutes**

3.1 Minutes of the October 6, 2021 Heritage and Museum Advisory Committee

4. **New Business**

4.1 Heritage Protection for Lakeshore Drive, Front Street and Windsor Avenue – Proposed Process

The Director of Development Services presented some background information regarding Lakeshore Drive, Front Street and Windsor Avenue and highlighted options for additional protection. He noted the planned project process on the creation of heritage conservation areas for Front Street, Windsor Avenue and Lakeshore Drive. He concluded with the potential financial implications and a proposed timeline.

The floor was opened to Committee Members for questions and comments. A Committee Member commented that the Windsor area is greater than just Windsor Avenue itself. A Committee Member commented that they feel this should be included in the 2022 Budget and supported moving this along. Councillor Sentes commented that staff should reference work that was completed by the RDOS a few years ago. A Committee Member commented on the need to have unique approaches for each of these areas and to prepare guidelines for developers. A Committee Member asked if any steps can be taken in the short term to help protect these areas while this process is undertaken. Staff responded that any short term protections would be difficult and would likely delay the overall long term process, but noted that Council can consider policy that is under development when making decisions on any potential developments.

**It was MOVED and SECONDED**

THAT the Heritage and Museum Advisory Committee recommend that Council support the project plan for the development of heritage protection policies and regulations for Lakeshore Drive, Front Street and Windsor Avenue.

**CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

4.2 North Gateway Design Charrette Update

The General Manager of Community Services provided an update on the North Gateway Design Charrette process that was recently completed. He noted major themes that were developed including: three key districts, three corridors, three gateways and one festival boulevard. He commented on the vision of the project, the guiding principles and showed the overall visual concept.

The floor was opened to Committee Members for questions and comments. A Committee Member commented on potential traffic issues at Riverside Drive if this project moves ahead. A Committee Member commented they feel that Sicamous and Memorial Arena should be heritage features that are maintained.
