

In the second stage, the City will conduct a complete review of the program and policies as identified in Council's priorities for this term. As part of this work, the rates for the remaining four DCC types will also be updated once an Infrastructure Master Plan is completed that identifies the Roads, Water, Sewer and Stormwater projects that will be eligible for DCC funding. These updates are expected to be completed in 2021.

"These changes in the short term will bring our rates and discounts more in line with those offered across the valley while we take the time to complete the full update and ensure it is in line with the vision for the City's future," says Director of Development Services Blake Laven.

Anyone interested in learning more about this work or sharing their feedback on the recommendations for the first phase of the update is invited to review the materials available on shapeyourcitypenticton.ca and attend an open house on February 25 from 4 pm to 7 pm at the Penticton Trade and Convention Centre. Staff will provide a presentation as part of the open house beginning at 5 pm. Materials will also be available at the City's new engagement kiosks located at City Hall, the library and the Community Centre. The City will be collecting feedback on the first stage until March 1, 2020.
